
### "Your Faith has Saved You." Children's Liturgy Activity October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021



### Gospel: Mark 10:46-52

In the Gospel today, we see Bartimaeus, a blind beggar crying to Jesus when He found him approaching his place. He shouted 'Jesus, son of David, have mercy on me'. The people around him scolded him and told him to keep quiet. But he only shouted all the louder. Hearing his voice Jesus stopped and asked his friends to call him. Bartimaeus was told to take courage and that Jesus is calling him. Hearing this, he threw off his cloak, jumped up and went to Jesus.

Jesus asked him 'What do you want me to do for you?'. Bartimaeus replied, 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'go, your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned, and he followed Jesus on the way.

Jesus is approaching us in Holy Eucharist, through the daily providence, through our parents, through our fellow beings etc. Do we recognise, believe, or respond to Jesus who is approaching us? Do we call out to Him for mercy just like Bartimaeus? Let us recognise and respond to Jesus approaching us.

When Bartimaeus called out, the people around him scolded him and asked him to keep quiet. What or who stops us from calling out to Jesus? We might get fed up or discouraged in calling to Jesus.

How did Bartimaeus respond? He called more loudly. Let us not stop calling but Call more loudly during discouragements. Let us persevere in our calling to Jesus amidst hopelessness and discouragements. Let us take courage! and run to him! Jesus is hearing us and is calling us. When Jesus calls us, let us throw all our comforts, jump up and run to him. Let nothing hold us back from running to Jesus.

Jesus asks each of us, 'what do you want me to do for you?' Do we know what we are asking for? Why are we seeking Jesus? Are we clear of our intentions? The blind man was very clear. He wished to see again. What is our wish?

Jesus says to Bartimaeus, 'Your faith has saved you.' Do we have faith in Jesus that he will give the best for us? Without faith it is impossible to please God because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him. - Hebrews 11:6

The blind man had faith. His faith helped him to persevere in calling Jesus amidst all discouragements. He trusted in the mercy of God. We need to have faith in Jesus and his mercy for his works to be manifested in us and through us.

How can we grow in faith? faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ.- Romans 10:17 Let us Know more about Jesus through the living word and respond to him in Faith. Holy spirit is our helper who reminds us of and teaches what Jesus has said - John 14:26. The church and sacraments too help us to grow in Faith in Jesus. Let us recognize Jesus' presence in our daily providence and increase in faith thanking and praising him and follow him in his way.




