
"Do not Doubt but Believe" Divine Mercy Sunday

Children's liturgy activity April 11th , 2021





Gospel: John 20:19-31

In the Gospel today, we see Jesus appearing amidst the disciples who are locked up in fear of Jews. Jesus gave them Peace and presented himself living. He showed them his wounds and side. On seeing Jesus, the disciples were filled in Joy. Strengthening them in faith, Jesus commissioned the disciples saying, 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' As he said, he breathed Holy Spirit on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit, for those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven, for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, the disciple was not with them when Jesus appeared. He refused to believe the testimony of his friends regarding the appearance of Jesus. Thomas demanded a personal experience to believe in resurrected Jesus. Jesus appeared again just for strengthening Thomas' faith. He asked Thomas to put his fingers on hands and to put his hands on Jesus' side and said not to doubt anymore but to believe. Thomas believed in resurrected Jesus. Jesus said, 'you believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen, but yet believe.' Everything is recorded in the Bible so that all may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the son of God, and by believing all may have eternal life.

Are we locked up in doubts and fears like the disciples? Are we struggling like Thomas to believe in Resurrected Jesus?


If so, let us offer all our fears, doubts, and weaknesses to our Lord. Amidst all our fears and lockdowns, Jesus is able to enter and fill us with his peace. Let us gaze to His wounds and pierced side and reach towards his great mercy, then the Joy of the resurrected Jesus will fill our hearts and His grace will fill our weaknesses. Jesus asks us not to doubt but to believe.

How can we increase in faith in Jesus? Faith increases through the living word. It is said in the Gospel, 'everything is recorded in this book so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the son of God, and that believing this you may have life through His name.'

We also see Jesus commissioning his disciples for same mission as He was sent by His father in heaven. Jesus gives strength for the mission by breathing Holy Spirit on them. He entrusts them with the mission of that 'whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Jesus is calling us too for carrying on His mission. So, let us fix our eyes on resurrected Christ and offer ourselves, all our doubts fears and weaknesses to him and pray to be filled in His peace, Joy and to be strengthened in faith by the power of Holy Spirit.


Join the dots and find out who appeared amidst the scaredy disciples. Fill in the speech bubble, what He said to the disciples.

Colour the dotted pieces to find out what did the disciples receive when Jesus breathed on them.





Feast of Divine Mercy: First Sunday after Easter
