### "Remain in My Love."

Children's liturgy activity May 9th, 2021





Gospel: John 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples that, He has loved them as the Heavenly Father has loved Him. Jesus asks his disciples to Remain in His love. He also tells them the way to remain in His love. Jesus remained in His Fathers love by keeping the commandments of Father. So, to remain in His love, keep His commandments.

He said to them this so that the same Joy that He experience in heavenly father will be in each of his disciples too. This is the commandment of Jesus: 'to love one another as I have loved you'. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends.

Jesus said to them that 'You are my friends if you do what I command you.' Jesus called them friends and said that they are not his servants because He has revealed to them everything that he learnt from his father.

It is Jesus who choose. He chose them to bear fruits that will last for eternity. To bear fruits according to His command 'Love one another 'and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name.

Through this Gospel, Jesus tells us that it is He chose us, to bear fruits according to his command 'love one another as He has loved us.'

He asks us to remain in His love by listening, obeying, living, and bearing fruits according to His commandment. So let us implore the grace of God to keep His commandments and seek constant help of Holy spirit to reveal and remind of Jesus words and pour God's love into our hearts to love one another just as Jesus loved us to bear fruits that lasts for eternity.



Materials Required: Paper Plate, scissors, glue, colors, string


