- This sacrament carries out the mission entrusted by Jesus to His apostles.
- Jesus shared His priesthood with the Apostles so that they could pass on this priestly power to other men and carry on the work of Jesus.
- Priests serve the people of God by offering Mass, forgiving sins, blessing marriages and anointing the sick.



In this sacrament, we receive the Holy Spirit once again but in a special way. It helps us to live a Christian life and it gives us strength and courage to be a good example to others.



- This sacrament is for those who are ill.
- The priest lays hands on the person just as Jesus did when He healed other people.
- Many people are healed by Jesus through the power of this sacrament



- This sacrament is the beginning of a new life of God's grace
- When we carry out this sacrament, he pours water on the person's forehead and says the same words that came from Jesus Himself, "I baptize you in the name of the father, and of the son and of the Holy Spirit."
- It also marks our soul with a sign that lasts forever and it cannot be taken away, therefore, it can be received only once.





- This sacrament was introduced on the day of the last supper. By receiving this sacrament we are united with Christ.
- During Mass, the bread and wine offered changed and are no longer bread and wine. They become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.
- · His body was to be offered on the cross and His blood was to be shed for the forgiveness of our sins.



- This sacrament is a sacred bond given to a man and a woman by God.
- The presence of Jesus at the wedding at Cana showed how Jesus wanted to bless the man and woman.
- A perfect example of this sacrament is the Blessed Virgin
 Mary and Saint Joseph. Mary's devotion to her family makes
 her a great role model for all wives and mothers. Joseph was
 very caring to Mary and Jesus; therefore, he is a special
 example for husbands and fathers. Jesus showed how all
 children are to love, obey and honor their parents.



- This sacrament forgives our sins by God's Mercy and brings us back to the church.
- After we confess our sins to the priest, we show how sorry
 we are and we promise to not do the sin again. The priest
 gives us a penance, usually prayers or good deeds, because
 we have sinned against God.
- Through this sacrament, we are helped to make peace with God and with our brothers and sisters whom we may have hurt either by words or actions.
